Strengthen the European dimension in higher education and research

Bringing transnational cooperation to a higher level contributes to a culture of excellence and inclusion, a true European identity, and global competitiveness and attractiveness

Consolidate universities as lighthouses of our European way of life

Strengthen quality and relevance for future-proof skills

In a fast changing environment, universities need to strengthen their capacities to equip young people, lifelong learners and researchers with the right competences and skills Foster diversity, inclusiveness and gender equality

Promote and protect European democratic values

Jniversities need to be places of freedom: for speech, thought, eaming, research

Empower universities as key actors of change in the twin green and digital transitions

Develop skills, competences and technological innovation for the green and digital transition

European

- The EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport
- Funding for programmes, projects and scholarships
- Fosters EU-EU and EU-international cooperation
- Erasmus+ 2021-2027:
 - builds on previous programme 2014-2020
 - more international
- Call 2023 currently open



Erasmus+ funding 2021-2027

- EUR 23.4 billion for Erasmus+ (2014-2020: EUR 14.7 billion)
- +60%!
- Mix of funding from internal and external funding instruments (budget headings).
- Additional funding for international actions (including Erasmus Mundus): + EUR 2.2 billion










International credit mobility (KA171)

 - Pacific

 - Latin America







Capacity building for higher education

- 2-3 year Partnerships of HEIs from EU MS & associated third countries and non-associated third countries.
- Lump sums
- Three types of project
 - FOSTERING ACCESS TO COOPERATION IN HE (24-36 months):
 - Smaller scope projects focused on universities & LDCs priority to newcomers €200-400k
 - **PARTNERSHIPS FOR INNOVATION IN HE** (24-36 months):
 - Iarger-scale projects focused on innovation, university/business and governance € 400-800k
 - **STRUCTURAL REFORM PROJECTS** (36-48 months)
 - Focus on policy reforms require involvement of ministries € 800-1000k



Closer alignment of European international cooperation actions with the EU priorities

Overarching priorities

- **Smart:** digital technology in the poorest countries by building foundations for digital skills, digital transformation and data technologies
- **Green deal:** including climate change, environment and energy; enabling a profound change in institutions and peoples' behaviour and skills.
- **Growth & Jobs:** foundational skills, 'soft' skills (e.g. problem solving, communication), and Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths (STEAM). Education and employability
- **Inclusion and diversity:** making education systems themselves more equitable.
- **Values:** laying the foundations for strengthening active citizenship and building specific expertise of future policy-makers in areas such as democracy, human rights and multilateralism
- **External policy priorities:** governance, peace and security, migration partnerships, SDGs



National focal points



Objective: establish a **world-wide network** of E+ focal points based on the model of the Horizon 2020 National Contact Points (NCPs) of the MSCA

Policy scope covering all sectors of the programme which have an international dimension



"European Universities"

- Independent call, but part of Erasmus+
- Deadline 31 January
- Topics included in the call:

Topic 1 – Intensification of prior deep institutional transnational cooperation

Support for **already existing deep institutional transnational cooperation alliances** including – but not limited to – the European Universities alliances selected under the 2019 Erasmus+ call for proposals – Tentative budget **345.6 MEUR**

Topic 2 – Development of new deep institutional transnational cooperation

Support for applicants **wishing to establish new deep institutional transnational cooperation** in a new 'European Universities' alliance – Tentative budget **38.4 MEUR**





Activities that can be funded

- Step-by-step approach towards deeper institutionalised transnational cooperation
- **Different models** for implementing and achieving the **long-term vision**
- Partners agree on a **Joint mission statement** including a **full joint strategy**
- Flexibility to shape the **Joint work plan of activities**
- Relevant to reach their strategic objectives and the long-term vision of European Universities
- Supported by efficient common management and governance structures

Optional/voluntary and only for Topic 1:

- A strategy to expand by adding new HEIs as full partners as part of the joint work plan of activities
 - Total number of full partners (including new HEIs joining) to be determined at proposal stage
